

5-Day Devotional: How Can I Share Without Getting Shut Down?

Confronting the Cancel Culture

Day 1: You Have an Assignment

Scripture: Matthew 28:19–20

Focus Thought:

You are not just saved—you are sent.

Jesus didn't suggest evangelism... He commanded it.

Many believers struggle with sharing their faith, not because they don't love God—but because they haven't fully accepted the responsibility.

The Great Commission is not for a select few.

It's not just for pastors, evangelists, or leaders.

It's for you.

And one day, we will give an account for what we did with that assignment.

This is not about guilt—it's about purpose.

You have been positioned in your family, your job, your school, your circle... on purpose.

Bottom Line:

You're not just saved—you're sent.

Reflection:

- Do I truly believe sharing my faith is my responsibility?
- Where has God placed me to be a witness?

Notes:

Day 2: You Don't Need Perfect Words

Scripture: 1 Peter 3:15

Focus Thought:

Preparation matters—but perfection is not required.

Many people avoid sharing their faith because they feel unqualified.

They think:

- “I don't know enough.”
- “What if they ask something I can't answer?”

But evangelism is not about having every answer.

It's about being ready to share your story and your hope.

God is not looking for perfect presentations.

He's looking for willing people.

When you step out, the Holy Spirit steps in.

Bottom Line:

You don't need perfect words—you need a willing heart.

Reflection:

- What fears are holding me back from sharing my faith?
- What has God done in my life that I can share?

Day 3: The Gospel Is Good News for Everyone

Scripture: Romans 1:16

Focus Thought:

The gospel is not about labels—it’s about life.

We live in a world full of division:

- Race
- Politics
- Background
- Status

But when you strip all of that away, every person shares the same need:

Hope.

Peace.

Purpose.

Restoration.

There is no different version of the gospel for different people.

There is only one message:

Jesus died so we could live.

And that message applies to everyone.

Bottom Line:

The gospel isn’t for some people—it’s for all people.

Reflection:

- Have I allowed labels or differences to stop me from reaching people?
- Who in my life needs to hear the good news?

Notes:

Day 4: Start With a Conversation

Scripture: Luke 5:31–32

Focus Thought:

People don't need arguments—they need care.

Jesus didn't avoid broken people.

He moved toward them.

He sat with them.

He listened to them.

He cared for them.

Sometimes the most powerful way to share your faith starts with one simple question:

“How are you doing?”

Real evangelism doesn't begin with preaching.

It begins with listening.

When people feel seen, heard, and valued—hearts open.

And when hearts open, truth can enter.

Bottom Line:

Don't start with a sermon—start with a conversation.

Reflection:

- Who can I intentionally have a conversation with this week?
- Am I listening to people, or just waiting to talk?

Notes:

Day 5: You Carry Power

Scripture: Romans 1:16

Focus Thought:

The gospel is not just information—it is transformation.

Paul said:

“I am not ashamed... because it is the power of God.”

The gospel has the power to:

- Heal broken hearts
- Restore lives
- Forgive sin
- Give purpose

When you truly understand what you carry, you won't hide it.

You won't be ashamed.

You'll look for opportunities to share it.

Because you're not just carrying words—

You're carrying life.

Bottom Line:

You don't carry a message—you carry power.

Reflection:

- Do I truly believe the gospel has power to change lives?
- Where can I share that power this week?

Notes:

Final Challenge

This week:

- Pray for **3 people** who need God
- Start **1 real conversation**
- Extend **3 invitations to church on Easter Sunday**

Because you are not here by accident.

You are positioned for impact.

And you might be one conversation away...

from changing someone's eternity.
