The Chrismon Tree, by PCUM Sunday School Students

The 'Chrismon' is a Christian symbol which represents Jesus Christ, God's very self, the One who comes at Christmas. A Chrismon Tree is decorated with white lights and gold Chrismon ornaments made of Styrofoam—with sequins, beads, piping, or other gold-colored adornments. Each Chrismon symbolizes Jesus Christ in a unique way. Chrismon ornaments are made in white and gold, with white representing the innocence of Jesus and gold representing the glory and majesty of God. As shared by our Sunday School children this morning, the Chrismon symbols and their meaning are:



The **chi ro** (pronounced kai-row), looks like an X and a P. These are the first two letters in the Greek word for Christ, so this symbol stands for Christ.



The **stars** represent the close relationship between the birth and death of our Lord. The six-pointed star is called the Creator's Star.



The **circle**, it has no beginning and no end, just like Jesus' love for each of us. The **descending dove** in the center represents the Holy Spirit.



The **orb** or world with a cross on the top, symbolizes Christ's power over the earth.



The **daisy** is the flower of simplicity. It stands for the innocence of the Christ child.



The **stylized fish** – Early Christians used the symbol of a fish as a secret sign of recognition.



The **serpent on the cross** – The serpent stands for humanity's sins—all we do and don't do that keeps us far from God—and the cross reminds us that Christ died for us, making possible forgiveness, reconciliation, and God's gifts of hope, peace, love and justice.



The **Cross of Calvary** has three steps at the base. The first step stands for faith, the second step for hope, and the third step for love.



The **butterfly** symbolizes our Lord's resurrection and the rebirth into a new and abundant life of those loved by Christ.



The **wheat and grapes** stand for the bread and wine of Communion, which represent the body and blood of our Lord, Jesus.



The **crown** depicts the kingship of our Lord and his victory over sin and death, as well as his place of honor at the right hand of God.
